OFIFC trainers will guide participants through a series of questions: "Who are Indigenous peoples?", "Where have they been?", "Where are they going?" Learning can then focus on answering, "What are our responsibilities?" These questions offer a critical pathway to action that strengthens cultural awareness, informs relationship building and begins to enhance organizational programs and policies. 


