



<u>Information from Provincial Office:</u>

The following information items were sent from provincial with the direction to share with the membership.

PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) contacting Guidance Counsellors:

PWC is a business consulting firm. They have been contacting school guidance counsellors in Ontario, seeking information on student course selection and other matters related to online education. They are reportedly offering gift certificates in exchange for participation in a telephone survey.

While the email says PwC is not working for the government or a political party, it does say the data collected could be used to develop online course options in light of the government's announcement regarding mandatory e-learning for secondary school students. Should you be contacted, you are strongly advised not to participate in the survey.

Doing so would serve to legitimize the government's plans around e-learning and potentially support the outsourcing of planning and delivery of these courses to private interests.
